Expected Student Outcomes Two-Year-Old Program

The goal of the Friends Christian School 2-year-old program is to spiritually, socially, emotionally, physically and cognitively prepare children for their coming years of formal schooling. To develop, nurture and equip children to positively impact their world for Jesus Christ. The Friends Christian Preschool staff desires to work along side and support the families in our program. The children in our 2-year-old program will...

Spiritual (S)

Begin to understand that God is a loving God (1)

- Know that God loves us
- Know that Jesus is God's Son
- Understand that Jesus wants a personal relationship with us
- Understand that God is watching over us and loves us at all times
- Develop positive feelings about themselves, as God loves each one personally
- Know that we can forgive others as Jesus has forgiven us
- Understand that Jesus died for our sins because He loves us
- Demonstrate understanding about God's love for them through: Bible stories, action between teacher and students, sharing God's love, sharing our love, learning to be kind to each other, feeling secure and valued and developing confidence in his/her ability to interact with others in God's world

Understand the Bible is a special book (2)

- Understand the Bible is true
- Understand the Bible is God's Word
- Learn different Bible stories
- Learn Bible verses
- Understand Bible concepts through arts and crafts
- Sing Bible songs

Use prayer to express their thoughts and needs (3)

- Know that they can ask God to help them and take care of them
- Know that we can talk to God through prayer at any time about anything

Freely share about God, Jesus, and the Bible with others (4)

Know Jesus wants us to share with others about Him.

Have a desire to attend church (5) Know God created the World (6)

- Know that God created all things
- Understand that God loves them and made them
- Learn about God and God's world
- Understand that they are special creations of God
- Learn that they are all different and unique
- Enjoy direct experiences with nature

Enjoy the process of moving from curiosity to satisfaction in a project because God delights in their work (7)

Take pride in his/her own work

Social/Emotional (S/E)

Enjoy and initiate friendships with a variety of individuals (1)

- Understand the importance of obeying parents and teachers
- Exhibit positive interactions with other children and adults
- Participate appropriately in classroom activities
- Demonstrate socially appropriate affection for teachers and friends
- Say, "Thank you", "Please" and "excuse me"
- Respect the rights of others
- Enjoy other children's company
- Move from parallel play to interactive play with other children
- Know that they are loved and are safe and are cared for by God and their teacher

Begin to learn the art of sharing (2)

- Understand the concept of sharing and at times to be able to share
- Begin to learn cooperation

Begin showing empathy and kindness (3)

- Empathize with feelings of others
- Understand being kind

Uses language to express self, developing positive conflict resolution (4)

• Express needs and feelings verbally to teacher and peers without being aggressive

Develop self-confidence in self-initiated activities (5)

- Participate independently in using household and classroom materials
- Express ideas for activities and initiates discussions

- Participate in discussions with teachers and friends
- Acknowledge actions and accomplishments verbally and nonverbally
- Demonstrate self-direction
- Demonstrate self-help skills (e.g., puts blocks away, pours juice, uses soap when washing hands)

Is comfortable participating in-group discussions (6)

- Exhibit pro-social behaviors Play independently, in pairs and small groups
- Know how to pretend play
- Know how to enter into play when a group of children are already involved in play.
- Take turns and begins to learn patience

Participates in group routines (7)

- Engage in purposeful activity for most of the time while moving independently from one activity to another
- Use toys and materials with care and cleans up or puts them away when finished
- Move through daily schedule and routines with ease
- Transition from one activity to the other without exhibiting signs of stress

Children exhibit attending and focusing skills (8)

- Demonstrate listening skills
- Respond to simple directions **Physical (P)**

Acquire and refine the fundamental movements of balance, movement, touch, and coordination (1)

- Work on the growth of the large and fine motor skills through perception, playground, music class, and developmental classroom practices
- Enjoy rhythm & movement
- Use objects and props to demonstrate coordination and expands spatial and cognitive learning (e.g. Balls, hula- hoops, Frisbees, balance beams)
- Demonstrate safe behaviors while using playground equipment and participating in activities

Acquire and develop fine motor skills (2)

Become acquainted with painting, scissors, drawing, etc.

Recognize that their body is created by God and takes special responsibility to care for it (3)

- Recognize that God created their body
- Be introduced to health and nutrition
- Make good food and activity choices

Cognitive (C)

General: (1) Enjoy creative expression

- Express themselves through dramatic center/dress-up & house center play
- Create through different types of materials and mediums for art
- Explore and experiment through different types of science projects Learn their colors, shapes & numbers through activities, books and concept learning time
- Find solutions to problems that arise during play
- Problem solving activities such as puzzles, simple scientific experiments, counting games, blocks, and cooking

Numeracy: (2) Understand math vocabulary, concepts, and directed activities

- Count numbers 1- 10
- Have appropriate counting, sorting, and comparison skills
- Begin to demonstrate an understanding of number and numerical operations
 o Spontaneously count for own purposes (e.g., counting blocks or cars, counting
 beads while stringing them, handing out napkins)
- Begin to develop knowledge of spatial concepts, e.g., shapes and measurement o Identify basic shapes in the environment (e.g., circle, square, triangle, star, diamond)
- Begin to understand and separates objects according to various properties including size, number length, heaviness, texture (rough to smooth) or loudness o Classify objects by sorting them into subgroups by one or more attributes (e.g., sorting counting bears by color into trays, separating a mixture of beans by individual size and shape
- Develop knowledge of sequence and temporal awareness
 o Start and stop on a signal (e.g., freezing in position when the music stops)
 o Describe the sequence of the daily routine and demonstrates understanding of
 basic temporal relations (e.g., "We will go outside after snack time.")

Language and Literacy: (3)

Understand the importance and use of language in the environment

- Learn to pray daily Hear and follow simple directions Express themselves through language to others throughout the day
- Problem solve by using their words Learn and memorize their Bible verses through repetition
- Sit for short periods at a time, and listen to stories, and be able to answer questions about the story
- Build language through books, finger plays, music, playing with others, taking turns, sharing etc.
- Participate in receptive language
- Desire to look at books

- o Show interest, pleasure, and enjoyment during listening activities by responding with appropriate eye contact, body language and facial expressions
- o Listen to stories
- o Listen while others are talking
- o Describe previous experience and relate it to new experiences or ideas
- o Ask questions to obtain information
- o Use language to express relationship, makes connections, describes similarities and differences, expresses feelings and initiates play with others
- o Participate in singing, fingerplays, chanting, retelling and inventing stories
- o Use language to communicate and negotiate ideas and plans for activities

Children demonstrate emergent reading skills (4)

- Recognize own name in a variety of contexts
- Display book handling knowledge (e.g., turning the book right side up, using left to right sweep, turning one page at a time, recognizing familiar books by cover)
- Exhibit reading-like behavior (e.g., pretends to read to self and others and read own writing)
- Use a familiar book as a cue to retell their version of the story
- Show an understanding of story structure (e.g., comment on characters, predicts what will happen next, asks appropriate questions and acts out familiar stories)

Be aware of different letter sounds (5)

- Listen and respond to environmental sounds, directions and conversations
 o Identifies sounds in the environment and distinguishes among them (e.g. a
 phone ringing, a truck passing by or blowing it's horn, animal sounds, musical
 instruments, voices of peers in room, etc.
- Begin to hear rhyming sounds in prominent words
